SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Provides public bus service for the cities of Detroit, Hamtramck, and Highland Park. Schedule changes typically occur in June and September, and sometimes in

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January. Under the "Open Door Policy," SMART drivers will also pick up persons waiting at D-DOT bus stops along SMART routes all day on weekends and weeknights after 6 pm if those persons flag down the SMART bus. Sells exact fare and discounted monthly, biweekly, and regional passes.
